- Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan was the first Vice President of India (1952-1962) and second President of India (1962-1967). He was born in Madras Presidency.
- He held the post of Vice-Chancellor of Andhra Pradesh from 1931-1936, followed by Vice-Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University in 1939.
- He was knighted in 1931, and was awarded the Bharat Ratna in 1945.
- The story behind Teachers' Day goes that when Dr. Radhakrishnan took the office of the second President of India in 1962, his students approached him to seek permission to celebrate September 5 as a special day.
- Dr. Radhakrishnan instead made a request of them to observe September 5 as Teachers' Day, to recognise the contribution of teachers to the society.
